## Sunshine Burnett Glasshouse Junior Tour Manual

### MANUAL FOR PLAYERS

#### **IMPORTANT NOTE:**

These events are played under the control of the SBG Committee with the assistance of the host Clubs. The events are for the enjoyment and learning experience of Junior golfers in the SBG District and beyond. While winning an event is exciting for the young golfers, the SBG Tour Match Committee requires all participants to understand and abide by Rule 1.2.a and play in the spirit of the game by:

- **Acting with integrity** – for example, by following the Rules, applying all penalties, and being honest in all aspects of play.
- **Showing consideration to others** – for example, by playing at a prompt pace, looking out for the safety of others, and not distracting the play of another player.
- **Taking good care of the course** – for example, by replacing divots, smoothing bunkers, repairing ball-marks, and not causing unnecessary damage to the course.

All adults involved with the SBG Junior Tour are required to also abide by the spirit of the game and to encourage and support **all** players, within the rules and conditions of the event.

## CONDITIONS OF PLAY

### 1. ELIGIBILITY

- 1.1. The SBG Junior Tour events will be played as stroke events with players competing for both gross and nett prizes as determined by the host Clubs.
- 1.2. All players must have a membership, not necessarily a full membership, of an A.G.U. affiliated golf club which affords them access to the A.G.U.'s member insurance.
- 1.3. *SBG District will provide additional funding toward prizes as indicated in the table in Section 9 on page 8.*
- 1.4. All players must be a minimum of 5 years of age and must be under the age of 18 years at the date of each event (consequently it is recognised that some players may play only part of a season).
- 1.5. Those players who play in the 18 hole events must be a financial member of a golf club that is Affiliated with Golf Australia and must be holders of a current Golf Australia handicap.
- 1.6. Players in short course (6 and 9 hole) events will be handicapped by the SBG Tour Committee in accordance with the Handicap System Rules at section 6. Players with a Golf Australia Handicap who compete in 18 hole competitions at their home club are NOT eligible to play in the short course (6 or 9 hole events). Players who have achieved their G.A. handicap by submitting only 9 hole cards are encouraged to participate in the 9 hole competition. Exceptions may be made at the discretion of the SBG Tour Committee.
- 1.7. All players competing in the 6 and 9 hole events should be accompanied by a responsible adult at all times.

### 2. GENERAL CONDITIONS OF PLAY

- 2.2. In the 18 hole division, boys will play from the tees designated as the general men's tee (usually blue or equivalent) and girls will play from the tees designated as the general women's tee (usually red or equivalent).
- 2.3. In the 9 and 6 hole divisions, both boys and girls will play from the temporary marked teeing grounds as per the distances specified in the specific rules for these divisions.
- 2.4. All events will be played under the R&A Rules of Golf and the Local Rules in force at the venue Club at the time of play, with some limited variations to the Rules of Golf in recognition of the ages and experience of the players in the 6 and 9 hole divisions. These variations are detailed in the specific rules for the divisions.
- 2.5. Although the Rules of Golf allow the use of Distance Measuring Devices, players must ensure that the device they use complies with the restrictions in Rule 4.3a(1) .
- 2.6. Slow play is unacceptable. All playing groups should strive to keep up with the playing group in front of them. Following repeated instances of slow play a player(s) may be penalized under Rule 5.6a

- 2.7. Players are encouraged to use the Golf Genius mobile app which can be download from Google Play or the Apple Store.
- 2.8. Where score cards are used, completed score cards are to be handed in to the scorer within 10 minutes after completion of the round. All cards should be checked for accuracy, clearly record the players name, handicap and gross scores and be signed by the player and their marker. In the case of 18-hole players.
- 2.9. All ties will be determined by countbacks as follows:
  - 18 hole division: Golf Australia (last 9, 6, 3, 1, hole-by-hole countback)
  - 9 hole division: last 6, last 3, last hole, hole-by-hole countback
  - 6 hole division: last 3, last hole , hole-by-hole countback

### 3. SBG JUNIOR TOUR HANDICAPPING SYSTEM RULES

- 3.1. Handicap limits for 9 hole and 6 hole events are 20 for boys and 24 for girls as managed by the SBG Junior Tour Match Committee.
- 3.2. If a player (in the 6 or 9 hole divisions) does not have an SBG Tour recognized handicap they will not be eligible for the nett division prizes on the day of their first game and will be given a starting handicap for the subsequent round based on their score **from that first round.**
- 3.3. All other nett scores (in the 6 or 9 hole divisions) returned at any SBG Junior Tour event will be assessed against the par of the course played on the day.  
Where a player's nett score:
  - 3.4. equals or is greater than par, there is no change to the handicap
  - 3.5. is less than par, the handicap will be reduced by 0.5 of a shot for every stroke below par. For example, a player on a handicap of 20 has a gross score of 36, and nett score of 16, and the par is 24. As they played 8 shots under par, their handicap will be reduced by (8 x 0.5) or 4.0 shots.
  - 3.6. Where a player has an SBG Junior Tour handicap that is not a whole number this will be the score used for future adjustments, but they will play off the number rounded to the nearest whole number. Handicaps of x.5 will be rounded up to the next whole number. For example a handicap of 14.5 will be rounded to 15. **If the player's nett score was 1 under par they would lose 0.5 off their SBG Tour handicap of 14.5 making their new SBG Tour handicap 13.0**
- 3.7. Once a player begins in the 9 hole division, they cannot play down in a lower division. This also applies at Club level so that if they are playing 6 or 9 holes at Club level they are expected to play in the same division in the SBG Junior Tour Events.
- 3.8. SBG Junior Tour handicap limits for 18 hole events are 36.4 G.A. for boys and 45.4 G.A. for girls.
- 3.9. If a player holds an 18 hole G.A. handicap they are required to play in the 18 hole division at SBG Tour events.
- 3.10. In very limited circumstances, where Clubs may have prematurely obtained a G.A. handicap for a player based **solely** on 9 hole rounds, the SBG Tour Match Committee would encourage the player to enter the 9 hole division of SBG Junior Tour events until they are capable of playing 18 hole competitions at club level.

#### 4. SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR JUNIORS

- 4.1. Juniors are not permitted in motorised carts during any SBG Junior Tour event, unless a medical certificate is provided prior to commencement of play. Unless as directed by the host club, a person should hold a drivers' license before driving a cart in accordance with the local rules of the host club.
- 4.2. Junior Golfers are **not permitted to smoke, vape or consume alcohol** whilst playing in an SBG Tour event. Any breaches will result in disqualification.
- 4.3. Any junior player found to be in breach of the rules of etiquette, such as throwing of clubs, course damage, or coarse language, may result in the imposition of a 1 or 2 shot penalty, depending on the severity of the offence. If continued, disqualification can be applied.

#### 5. SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR SUPPORTERS

- 5.1. The SBG District encourages family and friends of players to support the junior's participation in these events. However, this is on the basis that such support is within the spirit of the game of golf and is not detrimental to any child's enjoyment of their day at golf.
- 5.2. Under **NO CIRCUMSTANCES** are supporters permitted to "coach" players i.e. offer any form of technical advice, and under no circumstances are they to slow the pace of play with extended periods of advice
- 5.3. Specifically, supporters are requested to:
  - not walk with or talk regularly with a player or their caddie in a way that slows play
  - show appreciation of the good shots and efforts of **all** players in the group
  - under no circumstances become involved in the activity of the game, including offering rules advice.

#### 6. SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR CADDIES

- 6.1. Caddies are permitted on the basis that they will assist their player to play within the rules, provide support and encouragement, and help to ensure that pace of play is maintained.
- 6.2. Caddies may assist their players with club selection and general direction. They are **NOT** permitted to "coach" players i.e. offer any form of technical advice and under no circumstances are they to slow the pace of play with extended periods of advice.
- 6.3. Caddies are reminded that they may not stand on the line of the players shot at any time **from when the player commences to take their stance**. All caddies need to understand

and abide by Rule 10.2.b as a breach of the rule will incur a general penalty for their player, which is a 2 shot penalty added to the score for each time a breach occurs.

6.4. On the green, caddies may only assist briefly with determining the line of the putt with due consideration to the appropriate pace of play. Again, caddies must not stand on the line of play from the time the player **commences to take their stance**.

## 7. NINE (9) HOLE SHORT MODIFIED RULES

### MAXIMUM HANDICAP - 30 FOR BOYS & 36 FOR GIRLS

The 9 hole course is a modified length identified by markers, such as flags, as follows:

Par 5 – maximum 250m Par 4 – maximum 200m Par 3 – maximum 150m

**N.T. P.** is to be a 2<sup>nd</sup> shot. There will be two pin shots, one is designated for boys and one for girls. These may be on the same or different holes.

#### **Pace of Play:**

The round of 9 holes should be completed in not more than 2hrs 15mins.

All the Rules of Golf apply, including local rules, with the following exceptions:

**Maximum score per hole is 10:** Players may have up to 6 shots on the fairway. If they have not made it on to green, then they must pick their ball up and place it at the nearest point on the green, and then they are playing shot 7. When the player has played his/her 10 shots, they are to pick up their golf ball, mark a 10 on their scorecard and move on to the next hole.

**Play the ball as it lies:** no preferred lie unless given by the local rules of the course (check local rule board before play).

**Practice Swings:** to encourage the flow of the game, once at their ball and able to play, players should limit to **one practice swing** prior to each shot.

**Adult supervision:** All players under the age of 14 years should be accompanied by a responsible adult.

## 8. SIX (6) HOLES SHORT MODIFIED RULES

### MAXIMUM HANDICAP - 20 FOR BOYS & 24 FOR GIRLS

The 6-hole course is a modified length identified by markers, such as flags, as follows:

Par 5 – maximum 250m Par 4 – maximum 200m Par 3 – maximum 150m

**N.T. P.** is 2<sup>nd</sup> shot on a hole over 50m. Separate pins for boys and girls but they may be on the same hole.

**Pace of Play:** The round of 6 holes should be completed in not more than 90 minutes. To assist with pace of play, players should putt out on the green, not mark and wait for other players.

All the Rules of Golf and local rules apply, including counting all airswings, with the following exceptions:

**1. Maximum score per hole is 10:** Players may have up to 6 shots on the fairway. If they have not made it on to green, then they must pick their ball up and place it at the nearest point on the green, and then they are playing shot 7. When the player has played his/her 10 shots, they are to pick up their golf ball, mark a 10 on their scorecard and move on to the next hole.

**2. Bunkers:** One shot is to be attempted out of the sand bunkers; if unsuccessful they are to have a drop to the side of the bunker no nearer the hole, **adding 1 penalty stroke to the score.**

**3. Penalty Areas:** A player only attempts to cross a penalty area with one shot. If they go in the penalty area, they should drop a ball on the other side of the penalty area, **adding 1 penalty stroke to their score.**

**4. Preferred lie:** The ball may be placed on a preferred lie, within one card length and no nearer the hole, in the general area of the course.

**5. Practice Swings:** To encourage the flow of the game, once at their ball and able to play, players should limit to **one practice swing** prior to each shot.

**6. Adult supervision:** All players under the age of 14 years should be accompanied by a responsible adult.

**NOTE:** Players are encouraged to play 9 holes when they can play a 6-hole round in 37 shots or less for 3 consecutive rounds. If a Junior wins the Gross Champion trophy in a year AND has a handicap under 8, plus any junior with a handicap under 6, then we expect that Junior to possibly be in a position to move up to the next division the following year.

## 9. PACE OF PLAY CONSIDERATIONS

9.1. Slow play is unacceptable.

9.2. All playing groups should strive to keep up with the playing group in front of them. Following repeated instances of slow play a player(s) may be penalized under Rule 5.6a

9.3. Caddies may assist their players with club selection and general direction. They are NOT permitted to “coach” players i.e. offer any form of technical advice, and under no circumstances are they to slow the pace of play with extended periods of advice.

9.4. Players should attempt to adhere to the following times:

18 Holes – 4hr 15min      9 holes – 2hr 15min      6 holes – 90min

## 10. PRIZE ALLOCATIONS

10.1. The host club may provide prizes for the day at their discretion.

10.2. In addition the SBG District will provide prizes in the form of EFTPOS cards as follows (subject to numbers in each event):

## RESPONSIBILITIES

### 11. PLAYERS

All players, assisted by their caddies, have a responsibility to:

11.1. Regularly check the [SBG Tour Portal](#) to stay up to date with events, conditions of play, entry forms and results.

11.2. Arrive at the course and be ready to play at least 30 minutes prior to their tee time for 18 hole players and 30 minutes prior to the first tee time of the division (9 and 6 hole



players).

- 11.3. Introduce themselves to the other players in their group and play within the spirit of the game of golf as outlined in Rule 1.2.a, in good sportsmanship and with proper courtesy to all other players, caddies and supporters.
- 11.4. Play promptly and make every effort to remain within 2 shots of the match in front of them. Only one practice swing before making a shot.
- 11.5. Ensuring their score is correctly entered in to the Golf Genius mobile app and/or complete their scorecards with their markers, checking the score, signing the card and handing it in within 10 minutes of finishing their round.

## **12. CADDIES**

Caddies should be a positive resource for the young player and the SBG District is adamant that all caddies act in a helpful manner to all players. A junior player under the age of 14 years should have an adult caddie to assist with pace of play. Caddies are optional for older players. In all cases, it is the responsibility of the caddie to:

- 12.1. Assist their player to be ready to play at the required time. Download and read the modified rules handouts for the relevant division and the responsibilities of the players and caddies.
- 12.2. Provide advice to their player, if needed, on possible lines of play, club selection and similar matters in a manner that assists with the speed of play. Caddies must understand Rule 1.2.a. as standing on the line of play when their player commences to take their stance will result in a general penalty of 2 shots.
- 12.3. Keep all technical swing advice to an absolute minimum and discourage multiple practice swings that slow play. This is not the appropriate time to provide coaching, the player must be left to enjoy their game without undue emphasis on swing mechanics.
- 12.4. Provide rules advice if needed but in a supportive and respectful manner and assist with score keeping as needed.
- 12.5. Engage with their player and all other members of the group in a friendly and supportive manner that acknowledges the good play of all players, refrains from criticism and seeks to reduce performance pressure on the players.
- 12.6. If approached to speed up play, caddies must accept the direction in a positive manner and help the players to play more promptly.

## SPECIAL EVENTS

### 1. SBG TOUR NETT ORDER OF MERIT

- 1.1. This event is open to all players who participate in the SBG Junior Tour 18-hole division.
- 1.2. Points will be awarded to the top twenty (20) finishers, using the nett scores against par at each event, as follows:

- 1.3. Event sponsor will provide Drummond Golf Maroochydore vouchers to the value below for the top five (5) players.

To be eligible a player must compete in events in at least two (2) of the three (3) zones (Sunshine Coast, Glasshouse Mountains & South Burnett).

We will take the players best 8 results with the highest cumulative points over the SBG Junior Tour season as follows:

<i>Position based on best 8 cumulative points</i>	<i>Voucher value</i>
1 <sup>st</sup>	\$500
2 <sup>nd</sup>	\$250
3 <sup>rd</sup>	\$125
4 <sup>th</sup>	\$75
5 <sup>th</sup>	\$50

- 1.4. In the case of a points tie for any of the top 5 places, the order will be determined on a countback using the total of the last 3 nett scores of the players who are tied. If they are still tied the total of the last 2 nett scores will be used and if needed, the last net score. Where a tie cannot be resolved by countback, the player who has participated in the greatest number of events will be the winner.
- 1.5. All vouchers will be presented to the winners at the SBG Junior Tour Presentation Dinner at the end of the year.
- 1.6. The Executive Committee reserves the right to change or alter the number of events used to

determine the cumulative score.

## 2. SBG JUNIOR TOUR MASTERS CHAMPIONSHIP

2.1. This Masters Championship is open to all players who participate in the SBG Junior Tour 18 hole division.

2.2. A male champion and female champion will be decided in both gross and nett.

2.3. The Masters Championship will consist of four rounds of golf played over four nominated courses during the school holidays which usually occur in September/October.

2.4. The Championship will be awarded to the player with the lowest gross/nett total over the four (4) days.

2.5. Qualification for the Gross Masters Championship. Players will be invited to play based on the following:

- Male G.A. handicap of 10 or less, female G.A. handicap of 15 or less
- Player is under 18 years of age when the Masters Championship commences
- Wins a gross event at an
  - SBG Junior Tour event
  - Grant Field Junior Classic
  - Mt Coolum 2 Day Junior Classic
  - Sunshine Coast Open – Headland
  - Katherine Kirk/Gary Player Classic – Maroochy River
  - District Junior Open – Pelican Waters
  - IBF junior Classic – Twin Waters
  - Any Futures Tour event played within the SBG District
- In the event that a player wins a second SBG Junior Tour gross event the invitation from that event **MAY** be offered to the gross runner-up from the day whether that be on countback or gross score.

2.6. In the event of a tie for best gross total the championship will be resolved by:

- Initially a play-off over 3 holes designated by the committee
- If there is no resolution after the 3 hole play-off it will be resolved by a 150m shootout on a hole designated by the committee

- Players who have qualified under 2.5 above are also eligible for a net championship title over the four days
- 2.7. In the event that there is a tie for best nett total the championship will be resolved by countback based on the best nett score for day 4, 3, 2, 1 in that order
- 2.8. In the event that one or more of the original invitees can not play then invitations will go to players, at the discretion of the committee, on an emergency list of invitees compiled from players who:
- Lost an SBG Junior Tour event on countback
  - Have been runner-up in an SBG Junior Tour event on more than one occasion
- 2.9. Championship prizes will be presented at the SBG Junior Tour Presentation night.
- 2.10. Qualifiers from SBG Junior Tour events played later in the season than the Masters Championship is concluded will automatically qualify for an invitation to the Masters Championship the following year.
- 2.11. The winners of the current year's Masters Championship will automatically qualify for an invitation to the Masters Championship for the following year.

### **3. FRANK SCHMIDT CUP**

- 3.1. The Frank Schmidt Cup is a nett event played over one day at a nominated club.
- 3.2. A male and female Cup winner will be decided.
- 3.3. Qualification for the Frank Schmidt Cup. Players will be invited to compete based on the following:
- Only open to members of SBG affiliated golf clubs
  - Best nett score at each SBG Junior Tour event, both male and female, by a player from a club affiliated with an SBG golf club
  - Maximum G.A. handicap of 27 for both male and female
  - In the event that the nett on the day is won by a player whose G.A. handicap is over 27 the invitation to compete will revert to the player with the best nett score whose G.A. handicap is 27 or less
  - Player has won three (3) or more gross events throughout the year
- 3.4. Qualifiers will receive an invitation to take their place in the field for the Frank Schmidt Cup Final to be played at the nominated course on the day of the SBG Junior Tour presentation evening.
- 3.5. The Frank Schmidt Cup will be awarded to the player, both male and female, who

return the best nett score on the day. In the event of a tie the winner will be decided by the usual countback method.

3.6. The Frank Schmidt Cup winners will be awarded their trophy at the SBG Junior Tour Presentation night.

#### **4. SBG TOUR MATCH PLAY CHAMPIONSHIP.**

4.1. Competition in the SBG Tour Match Play Championship will be by invitation only.

4.2. The championship is contested in five (5) divisions as follows:

- Division 1 male G.A. handicap of 5.0 or less
- Division 2 male G.A. handicap greater than 5.0 but less than 19.0
- Division 3 male G.A. handicap of 19.0 or greater
- Division 1 female G.A. handicap of 10.0 or less
- Division 2 female G.A. handicap greater than 10.0

4.3. Qualifying handicaps will be as of the date the invitations to compete are sent out.

4.4. Playing conditions:

- Division 1 male and Division 1 female – off the stick
- All other Divisions are handicap match play
- In the handicap divisions the players G.A handicap for the first round remains the same for the subsequent rounds

4.5. Qualification for Matchplay Championship. Players will be invited to compete based on the following:

- They have played at least two (2) SBG Junior Tour events prior to the date the match play is scheduled
- Invites will go to the lowest eight (8) handicapped players in each division who meet the above requirement
- In the event that an invited player is unable to compete then the invitation will be extended to the next lowest handicapper, at the committee's discretion, until the draw for that division is filled

4.6. Match play championship format:

- Play takes place over two (2) consecutive Sundays
- Day 1 - first round – 40 players in total

- Day 2 - second round in the morning. Finals in the afternoon
- Matches commence at 7:30a.m. on both days
- Players will be seeded based on G.A. handicap

4.7. Winners will be awarded their trophy at the SBG Junior Tour Presentation night.

## **5. INTER-CLUB SHIELD**

The Inter-Club Team Shield was designed to give juniors from all clubs the opportunity to represent their clubs and their friends as a team and we feel that the benefits gained out of this concept will set in place a great challenge to all clubs and their juniors. At each event we ask clubs to select four players to represent their club and submit their names and handicaps to the SBG Junior Tour Committee prior to competition. The worst score is dropped and the combined nett score of the other three nominated players is added together.

The club with the best combined score will be declared the winner.

Points are allocated to highest scoring three teams as follows:

- 4 points for winning
- 2 points for second
- 1 point for third

All points will be added to the team ladder after each event and at the end of the year the club with the most points will be declared the winner and awarded The Inter - Club Team Shield at their Annual Junior Presentation Dinner.
